Child Safeguarding Statement

Name of service being provided

Music Network's Learning and Participation Programme provides bespoke educational music activities around the country to children, young people and adults, in partnership with local organisations / teachers.

Nature of service and principles to safeguard children from harm

The Learning and Participation Programme offers educational activities related to the Music Network Touring Programme, Music Network Artist Residency and other stand-alone projects, for example:

- Instrumental and vocal workshops
- Composition / improvisation workshops
- Demonstration / question and answer sessions
- Performance opportunities
- Mentor sessions

Activities are generally facilitated by performing musicians during their tour/residency or in advance of/following on from tours/residencies. Activities may also take place as stand-alone events or in relation to stand-alone performances. Music Network generally works in partnership with a host organisation in order to coordinate activities. The local coordinator liaises on behalf of the participant group (this may be an existing group, or individuals coming together for the Learning and Participation project) as well as attending the activity/arranging an alternate supervisor (if necessary), and documenting the activity.

Risk assessment

We have carried out an assessment of any potential for harm to a child while availing of our services. Note- this relates to harm as defined in the Children First Act 2015, and is separate to a health and safety risk assessment carried out in relation to activities. Below is a list of the areas of risk identified and the list of procedures for managing these risks.

Risk identified	Procedure in place to manage risk identified
Risk of harm due to inadequate supervision of participants.	Where activities are coordinated by Music Network only: Music Network arranges a participant to staff ratio which allows for sufficient supervision.
	Where activities are coordinated by Music Network in partnership with a host organisation: the local coordinator arranges the supervision of activities.
Risk of harm due to inappropriate relationship / communication between participant and facilitator	Where activities are coordinated by Music Network only: Facilitators are provided with a copy of the Music Network Child Protection Policies and Procedures (which includes a Code of Behaviour), and sign a Declaration confirming they have read and will adhere to the guidelines therein. Where activities are coordinated by Music Network in partnership with



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	a host organisation: All facilitators are provided with a copy of the Music Network Child Protection Policy and Procedures (which includes a Code of Behaviour), and sign a Declaration confirming they have read and will adhere to the guidelines therein, in addition to adhering to the host organisation's policies and procedures.
Risk of child being harmed by another child	Where activities are coordinated by Music Network only: Music Network arranges a participant to staff ratio which allows for sufficient supervision. Music Network has a Participant Code of Behaviour in place, as part of the Child Protection Policy and Procedures document. Where activities are coordinated by Music Network in partnership with a host organisation: the local coordinator arranges the supervision of activities.
Risk of harm not being reported properly and promptly	Where activities are coordinated by Music Network only: Music Network's Child Protection Policy specifies procedures for the recording and reporting of complaints, and lists contact details for the Designated Liaison Person and Deputy Designated Liaison Person, and relevant Tusla representative. Where activities are coordinated by Music Network in partnership with
	a host organisation: Music Network staff / facilitators will adhere to the partner organisation's policy and procedures, including liaising with the partner organisation's Designated Liaison Person
Risk of harm in one-to-one teaching situation	Music Network arranges one-to-one sessions for participants aged over 18 only

Procedures

Our Child Safeguarding Statement has been developed in line with requirements under the Children First Act 2015, the *Children First: National Guidance*, and Tusla's *Child Safeguarding: A Guide for Policy, Procedure and Practice*. In addition to the procedures listed in our risk assessment, the following procedures support our intention to safeguard children while they are availing of our services:

The mandated persons are the Designated Liaison Person and the Deputy Designated Liaison Person. Their details are given at the end of Music Network's Child Safeguarding Statement and in Music Network's Child Protection Policy, Section 1: Child Protection Policy Statement- Key Roles and Responsibilities.

Procedure for appointing a relevant person

Music Network identifies suitable staff members to take on the roles of Designated Liaison Person and Deputy Designated Liaison Person. Both staff members undertake the relevant training required for their role.

All procedures are detailed in the Music Network Child Protection Policy, which is available at the Music Network offices and on the Music Network website (www.musicnetwork.ie)

Implementation

We recognise that implementation is an ongoing process. Our service is committed to the implementation of this Child Safeguarding Statement and the procedures that support our intention to keep children safe from harm while availing of our service. This Child Safeguarding Statement is up to date as of April 2019 and will be reviewed in April 2021, or as soon as practicable after there has been a material change in any matter to which the statement refers.
