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INTRODUCTION

Karan Thompson Consulting Limited (KTCL) is pleased to present this report to Music Network and the Music Education Working Group in respect of the work carried out as part of the Music Network Music Education Project (Phase 1). We were delighted to be chosen to carry out this work on behalf of Music Network and would like to acknowledge the assistance and guidance offered to the project team during the course of the assignment.

The background to the project was an intention to follow on from the publication of the Music Network Report of a Feasibility Study, *A National System of Local Music Education Services* (Report), to develop and implement an awareness building strategy which encompassed all stakeholders for the development of an improved music education system in Ireland through the advancement of the recommended national system of Local Music Education Education Services.

It was intended that the outputs from the project would strengthen the argument for improved music provision throughout Ireland through:

- a comprehensive process of information and consultation with the various stakeholders, agencies, relevant Government Departments, Committees and local government structures
- assisting in the development of those groups who have already expressed an interest in developing a Music Education Partnership (MEP) in their region
- ensuring that the investment made by Music Network and the Arts Council be leveraged to best suit onward development and implementation of a national system of music education following the completion of this phase of the project.

In this report we present the outcomes of the project over the 6-month timeframe and provide recommendations for further developments in this area to inform Phase 2 of the project.

2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Report is intended to provide information relating to the Music Network Music Education Project (Phase 1) January – June 2007. The aim of this project being the development and implementation of an awareness building strategy, which encompassed all stakeholders, for the development of an improved music education system in Ireland through the advancement of the recommended national system of Local Music Education Services.

The following elements formed the basis of the project:

- i) Communication / Awareness Building Strategy Development and Implementation
 - National Seminar
 - Information Awareness Meetings / Policy Makers Information Sessions
 - MEWG Submission to the Committee on Arts & Education
 - Mapping the Territory 2
- ii) Enabling Partnership Development
- iii) Music Education Provision Mapping Process
- iv) Public Relations and Media Strategy

The recommendations from this project are as follows:

- There is a need to build upon the recent success of the awareness building campaign for improved music education in Ireland through the implementation of the feasibility study model and the project team recommends that Music Network and the Arts Council continue to build on this phase of work to actively engage key agencies including the Department of Education and Science to this end.
- 2. The success of emerging partnerships lies in their ability to create a sustainable structure at the outset. Alongside the provision of support tools for partnerships documentation as prepared during this project, additional assistance by Music Network with funding from the Arts Council, at the development stage of an emerging partnership is essential. This support could be afforded in a number of ways:
 - Mentoring assistance to the local lead organisation in engaging key partners or potentially to act as an agent to assist the engagement process on behalf of the agency who wishes to develop the partnership
 - Identification of the needs of emerging and extant partnerships within the MEP framework
 - Development of additional support materials to develop and assist the role of the Music Development Manager within the emerging partnerships in the operation of an MEP
 - In the absence of the publication to date of the Arts & Education Report there is a requirement for an agency, such as Music Network, to bring those operating as MEPs together on a regular basis to share best practice in relation to structures, approaches to provision in different locations and to different demographics and coherent development strategies for MEPs

- 3. The Arts Council in endeavouring to achieve their strategic goal of implementation of the Music Network report needs to provide assistance on an ongoing basis to Music Network for the roll out of the Music Education Partnership process on a national scale.
- 4. In order to ensure a coordinated approach to music education provision it is important that the Arts Council through Music Network develop relationships with those who are already embarking on a partnership path.

We look forward to further developments in this area and wish the MEWG and Music Network continued success.

3. TERMS OF REFERENCE

The initial project brief outlined Music Network's proposals for the development and implementation of an awareness building strategy for the advancement of the Local Music Education Services Partnership model.

Music Network indicated its terms of reference for the project as follows:

- Develop / utilise existing regional and national networks to facilitate effective communication and collaboration towards enhanced music education provision in Ireland.
- Draw on relevant national and international research to support the case for enhanced music education provision in Ireland.
- Develop advocacy for the LMES model through stakeholders in existing LMES pilots.
- Identification of locations where prospective local partners have expressed interest in establishing a Local Music Education Service Partnership.
- Facilitate the development of these new partnerships within the locations identified.
- Develop a presentation for delivery to relevant bodies, agencies etc. to provide a platform for the dissemination and discussion of arguments in favour of an inclusive music education for all.
- Identify and present to key organisations, agencies and individuals the value and necessity of an inclusive and comprehensive music education.
- Develop communication between these relevant national groups and the national music education network.
- Develop and implement an awareness-building campaign which focuses on the importance of a holistic music education for all.
- Identify and target other suitable platforms through which to reinforce the need for an improved music education system in Ireland.

Additionally Music Network identified a number of key deliverables for the assignment as outlined below:

- Increased awareness of the feasibility study model, the current pilot process and their outcomes and achievements
- The establishment of between 10 and 14 new LMESPs
- The development of advocacy for enhanced music education in Ireland through new and existing LMESPs
- Increased awareness off the need for an enhancement in music education provision in Ireland among key stakeholders and policy makers

This report details the outcomes of the various project elements which constituted the first phase of the Music Education Project.

4. MUSIC EDUCATION WORKING GROUP

The Music Network Education Working Group was specifically established (with funding from the Arts Council) to oversee the implementation of a 6-month phase of advocacy, awareness building and networking focused on improving provision for music education in Ireland, with specific reference to the advancement of the recommended national system of Local Music Education Services.

This 6-month period of work (January – June 2007) represented the first phase of a longer-term process, the aim of which is to raise awareness of the value of music education (instrumental/vocal tuition, as well as music curriculum support in schools), and of the need for enhanced provision via a national system of local Music Education Partnerships, to ensure equality of opportunity for students in Ireland.

The Music Network Music Education Working Group comprised representatives of the following sectors/organisations:

- Expert in delivery of the school music curricula
- Local authority representative
- VEC representative
- Arts Council
- Music Network

3. <u>Approach & Outcomes</u>

The proposed approach by KTCL as outlined in our original proposal reflected the requirements of the tender proposal document from Music Network. During the course of the project some alterations were made to the original proposal as per the direction of the Music Education Working Group in order to affect the highest level of awareness building for the implementation of the feasibility study model. The following are the elements which were carried out to fulfil the revised project brief:

- 1. Communication / Awareness Building Strategy Development and Implementation
 - National Seminar
 - Information Awareness Meetings / Policy Makers Information Sessions
 - MEWG Submission to the Committee on Arts & Education
 - Mapping the Territory 2
- 2. Enabling local partnership development
- 3. Music Education Provision Mapping Process
- 4. Public Relations and Media Strategy

i) Communications & Awareness Building Strategy

KTCL built a comprehensive awareness building strategy through a range of interventions as follows:

National Seminar

"Striking the Right Note" was developed as an Information Awareness Seminar and was held in the Coach House, Dublin Castle on 18th April 2007. The rationale for the development of the Seminar was to bring together key influencers in the music education field and inform participants about the current landscape of partnership based local music education provision. To enable them to learn about the MEP pilot projects and to explore the key issues in music education first hand and to plan the way forward for the mainstreaming and implementation of a national system of local Music Education Partnerships.


These objectives were achieved through a series of presentations from practitioners and providers who shared their experience of working within the MEP structure and of the status of emerging MEP models, performances by those benefiting from the MEP provision and facilitated breakout sessions and round table debate on future for music education provision in Ireland.

The seminar was developed as a mechanism to reengage the music and formal education sectors towards the implementation of the feasibility study model on a wider scale. Those who attended the seminar included representatives from¹:

1. Statutory bodies and policy makers at national, regional and local level

- 2. Music education institutions and practitioners
- 3. Representative Bodies
- 4. Individuals and organisations interested in current developments within the music education sector



The seminar also included a series of breakout sessions which were devised as enabling forum for those who are most closely involved in music education provision and are committed to its development to look closely at the strategic and operational issues which relate to the national implementation of LMESP model². These sessions were facilitated by those operating at the appropriate level within the sector. The topics discussed in the breakout groups included:

- 1. <u>Music Education Council</u>
 - Role & Remit
 - Potential cross artform structure
 - Communication with local MEPs
 - Best practice model learning from international models
 - Evaluation and quality management

- 2. Educational Issues
 - Artistic and educational policy and practice
 - Ensemble / individual tuition element
 - Examinations and scholarships
 - Curriculum development model
- 3. <u>Administrative issues</u>
 - Infrastructure premises / location
 - Teacher's contracts qualifications and equivalency
 - Entry criteria / management waiting lists etc
 - Identification of talent student progression through MEP
- 4. <u>Partnership Development</u>
 - Identification of key partners
 - Steering Committee remit
 - Maintaining motivation and partnership
 - Resources for MEP development
 - Relevance to local needs
- 5. Existing Provision
 - Incorporation of existing music education provision into national MEP structure
 - Continuity of existing schools, services, programmes
 - Shared tutoring resources
 - Funding issues
- 6. Advocacy and Supports
 - Identification of advocacy partners
 - Management of advocacy process
 - Required Supports
 - Support providers

There followed a feedback session from the breakout groups which informed the panel debate which looked towards the Next Steps in relation to planning for a national system of music education services.

Information gathered at the seminar (both during breakout sessions and panel debate) has been published on the Music Network website and communicated to all those who attended the seminar. The main points resulting from the seminar were:

- The 2003 Music Network report, "A National System of Local Music Education Services" – Report of a Feasibility Study", is widely considered to be most workable blue print for implementing a national system of music education services. The consensus from delegates was that rather than going over the ground that was visited at the time of this report, the issue now needs to progress to the point where the findings of the report are implemented. The success of the partnership model outlined in the report lies in the establishment of an inter-agency partnership that is managed and supported by a national agency.
- 2. It is imperative that a comprehensive evaluation of the existing pilot models in Donegal and Dublin be carried out by the Department of Education and Science as soon as

possible. Findings from this audit can then be used to inform the national implementation process for the roll-out of the partnership model.

- 3. The establishment of Music Education Council is important as the necessary structure for the cohesive development of a national system of music education services within the formal and non-formal education sectors that will provide a consistency of services nationally.
- 4. The establishment of at least 10 further Music Education Partnerships supported through an inter-agency approach, is seen as an essential next step. Delegates were encouraged to talk to representatives of their local VECs, local authorities etc. in relation to putting partnership structures in place.
- 5. Provision for the role of Music Development Manager in each of these newly established MEPs.

Information Awareness Meetings / Policy Makers Information Sessions

The project team also carried out a series of information / awareness building meetings as part of the project. These meetings were designed to provide an opportunity for presentation of the model and its potential for national implementation. At the time of writing this report not all meetings had been scheduled. The following is a status update on each of the meetings:

- 1. Association of Local Authority Arts Officers Agreed to provide information through association. Music Network to present at next meeting of members on 26/27 November 2007.
- Association of Secondary Teachers in Ireland Meeting held with Moira Leydon, AGS: Education & Research and Mary McFadden. The meeting highlighted a number of potential partnerships which might be coordinated between primary and second level music provision, the wider music education community and formal education support structures. The ASTI would welcome further communication in relation to the development of MEPs as it moves forward.
- 3. City & County Managers Association No response to communication as yet. Letter sent again 31 July.
- 4. DAST / DES Special Committee on Arts & Education Attended meeting on 7th February 2007. To inform the deliberations of the committee prior to the development of their report to Government. Additionally a submission was prepared on behalf of the MEWG and presented to the Committee advocating for the implementation of the MEP model on a national basis.
- Department of Education & Science Communication sent to Minister Mary Hanafin requesting meeting. Minister responded on 10th July 2007 and has advised that she will meet with Music Network during September 2007.
- 6. Education Resource Centres Attended meeting 11th July 2007. In attendance, Bernadette Mc Hugh, Chair of ATECI and Sally Bonner, Convenor of full-time Directors.

Presentation to be given by Music Network at Association of Directorates & Managers AGM during September 2007. The Education Resource Centres wish to develop links for the development of MEPs through their Continuing Professional Development Programmes for teachers. The Directorate welcomes further discussion to take this partnership initiative forward.

- 7. Irish National Teachers Organisations Meeting held with Deirbhile Nic Craith. It was stated that it would be beneficial for the INTO to see how MEPs operate on the ground, how they impact on students involved, benefits and outcomes, and how the pilots have interfaced with primary schools. To this end, a report was requested outlining the aforementioned, programmes in place and existing structures to heighten the INTO's awareness of the initiative and particularly its impact at a primary level. Draft thesis provided to the INTO during July 2007. Further communications may be developed late August
- 8. Irish Vocational Education Authority Request to put our communication in writing to Michael Moriarty rather than a request for a meeting. No response received to this communication to date. Letter resent 31 July 2007.
- 9. **Mapping the Territory 2** Inclusion in the partnership / networking development process for the recent "Mapping the Territory 2" Forum for the Arts, Heritage and Education sectors, which was presented by IMMA and The Ark and took place on 29th May 2007. Presentation to the forum by Music Network CEO, Deirdre McCrea on the role and remit of Music Network and its relationship with its network partners.
- 10. National Association of Principals & Deputy Principals (Creative Engagement). Meeting held 11th June 2007. Information to be communicated to members through national association.
- 11. **National Council for Curriculum and Assessment** Meeting rescheduled from 22nd June 2007. Awaiting new date for meeting.
- 12. National Parents Council Post Primary No response to communication.
- 13. National Parents Council Primary Agreed to meet. Awaiting commencement of new CEO on 1 August. Meeting will be schedule dafter this date
- 14. Office of the Minster for Health & Children Meeting held wth Sylda Langford on 29th June 2007. It was suggested that Music Network could attend a meeting of the National Children's Strategy Implementation Group to make a short presentation on MEPs and that when more local groups have commenced their work, presentations to Children's Services Committees could also be arranged. It was also suggested that Music Network should put Sean O'Longáin in contact with Michael McLoone and that Michael McLoone might be in a position to speak at a VEC meeting (in the context of the potential to get the VEC to deliver the MEPs and link with the Children's Services Committees locally). Furthermore that contact be made with Jacinta Stewart as CEO of Dublin VEC so that the angle of detention centres may be explored.
- 15. **Post Primary Music Teacher's Association** Meeting Held 14 June 2007. Overview information to be forwarded to members and presentation to be given by Music Network at National Conference planned for October 2007

16. **State Examinations Commission** – Meeting arranged – Monday 21st June. Oliver Hynes sent communication to advise that there was really no particular gain for Music Network to meet with the SEC and that exploration of the model is communicated to the NCCA instead.

17. Teachers Union of Ireland – Awaiting response to communication

The project team will meet with those who have indicated their availability and interest to date, namely; the National Council for Curriculum and Assessment and the National Parent's Council, Primary in order to ensure maximum advocacy and awareness building for the development of music education provision.

Additionally we have developed an awareness building presentation which is used for the above meetings and tailored to suit the needs of the individual stakeholders. This tool may also be utilised for the proposed presentations at national congress. These presentations provide an opportunity to establish the position for the enhancement of music education provision for all.

MEWG Submission to Special Committee for Arts & Education

The Music Network Music Education Working Group (MEWG) presented their proposal to the Special Committee on Arts and Education in furtherance of the potential development for a national system of local music education services. The Working Group welcomed the call for submissions as a positive step in the development of a partnership approach between arts and education and as one which can only serve to enhance the education of our nation's children.

The submission outlined the guiding principle behind the submission to the Committee as the improvement of the provision of services for music education on a national scale. The document outlined the key issues for consideration in relation to the structures, systems and resources required to develop and facilitate a comprehensive national system of music education provision.

The Working Group identified a number of key recommendations for the Committee in preparation for their report back to the Department of Arts, Sport and Tourism on 1 May 2007 including the importance of the establishment of the Music Education Council and the national roll-out of a the MEP system of music education service provision. They also expressed their eagerness for the report to be published.

The recommendations from the submission were as follows:

 The continuance of the existence of the Special Committee on Arts and Education (or alternative body with similar remit) subsequent to the presentation of their Report to the Department of Arts, Sport and Tourism. The MEWG views this Committee as a positive step in the development of a coherent partnership between the DES and DAST towards the future development of arts education in Ireland.

- 2. The establishment of a Music Education Council as outlined in the Music Network Report as the necessary structure for the cohesive development of a national system of music education services within the formal and non formal education sectors which will provide a consistency of services nationally.
- 3. That the Music Education Partnership model as outlined in the Music Network Report is implemented on a phased national basis and is supported through an inter-agency approach.
- 4. The MEWG is of the view that there is no benefit to be accrued in adding another level of service to the existing patchwork of provision and that therefore the development of a coherent National Implementation Plan for the management and development of existing and emerging Music Education Partnerships should be considered the most appropriate mechanism by which music education services will be provided.
- 5. A comprehensive evaluation of the existing pilot models in Donegal and Dublin should be carried out by the Department of Education and Science. Findings from this audit be used to inform the national implementation process for the roll-out of the MEP model as outlined in the Music Network Report.
- 6. A wider audit of existing music education provision be carried out in order to avoid duplication of service provision and a consistency of quality, scale and relevance of services for all constituents and to consider the implications of the potential adaptation of existing models of provision into the MEP model.
- 7. That resources be provided for the successful implementation of the model in the guise of existing structures and services within the DES / DAST remit, support and development of inter-agency partnerships, funding mechanisms for development of new structures, teaching resources, evaluation and quality assurance and value for money within the proposed MEP model.

ii) Enabling Partnership Development

The original intention in the initial project plan was to develop a series of sectoral / industry liaison meetings to meet with the various potential partners in identified locations who had expressed an interest in becoming an MEP or were "MEP ready", to develop relationships and work with the parties on the ground in each location towards the development path which should be taken to establish a sustainable MEP.

Some consideration was given to the potential for Music Network, the MEWG and the Project Team to assist the development of emerging Music Education Partnerships and to essentially "choose" those who would be offered support. The MEWG considered that the purpose of the assignment was to develop advocacy and awareness around the need for developments in music education rather than providing a potential scenario whereby emerging MEPs would look towards Music Network and the Working Group as a potential source for funding for their partnership development process where such an avenue for funding did not exist within the project fund or the associated organisations.

It is interesting to note that the Partnership Development session at the seminar found that many areas could be progressed in the absence of immediate funding. As such the MEWG and the project team devised an approach to provide a guide to the development of MEPs the aim of which is to assist the set-up and development phase, when costs can be managed. It provides the partnering organisations with best practice relating to the development of partnerships and related issues. This guide is available on the Music Network website.

iii) Music Education Provision Mapping Process


Following on from the Enabling Partnership Development area of the project an additional element was added to the project. This element was the mapping of current music education provision and partnership development on a national scale.

A survey questionnaire was designed to explore where music education /music education related partnership arrangements were already in place and the nature of such partnerships³. It also identified the range of genres of music covered in each location. Additionally it requested information on how the responding organisation / agency could assist in partnership development by identifying what supports it could provide and those it would require for partnerships to be developed and be sustainable. This survey was distributed to relevant (music) agencies / organisations funded by the Arts Council, education centres, arts centres, local authority arts officers, VECs and to the delegates who attended the Music Network seminar. A total of 52 organisations provided detailed information relating to music education provision and partnership developments supporting this provision. The percentage response was assisted by a telephone follow up to those who had attended the seminar in order to ensure that we had the fullest of information available for analysis.


The Project Team analysed the data received and the entire response to the mapping process are available in pdf format from Music Network and attached in Appendix 4 of this

document. The MEWG are aware that there is room for additional work to be carried out in order to map comprehensively music education provision on a national scale. We highlight below the key findings from the mapping process as a series of charts illustrating various different elements of the survey. The chart below shows the range of genres offered across the responding agencies. Many agencies offer more that one genre.



The chart below shows the types of agencies / organisations who are currently working in partnership. This information is further broken down to identify those working in partnership within each county area.



Agencies Currently Working in Partnership





Organisations Who Responded




The survey investigated the range and type of music education initiatives being offered by each agency. The chart on the following page illustrates the range of music education initiatives currently being offered around the country. These initiatives a representative of the services provided by responding organisations only, rather than providing the wider picture of the entire range of services available on a county by county basis.




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One of the key areas of concern for the MEWG and the Project Team was the identification of the range of supports which are required for sustainable partnership development. To this end we asked the respondent organisations to provide us with a list of those areas were they considered they required support for further development of their partnership initiatives. The Chart below outlines this range of services as determined by those operating in the sector.





Furthermore, the survey requested information from the respondents as to how they could enhance partnership development and what supports they would have available to other partnering agencies in order to move this process forward. The response to this question proved to be very insightful and indicated a level of support at local level which would greatly assist in the implementation of the MEP model on a national basis.



4. Public Relations and Media Campaign

The Project Team greatly appreciated the input and support from the Music Network Marketing Manager and her team in the development and identification of PR opportunities associated with the project and development of a public relations plan to establish the most advantageous route for creating awareness of the need for enhanced provision of music education services in Ireland. We believe that this element of the project provided a voice for the advocacy of developments in provision for music education in Ireland at national, regional and local level.

The aim of the public relations campaign was to develop a national and regional public relations campaign to raise awareness of the work of Music Network in campaigning for an improved music education system in Ireland. The objectives of the campaign were:

- To make the case for the importance of a music education accessible to all
- Provide a call for response to music provision / partnership mapping process
- Generate media interest in the seminar
- Work within the timeframe January June 2007

5. <u>Recommendations</u>

- There is a need to build upon the recent success of the awareness building campaign for improved music education in Ireland through the implementation of the feasibility study model and the project team recommends that Music Network and the Arts Council continue to build on this phase of work to actively engage key agencies including the Department of Education and Science to this end.
- 2. The success of emerging partnerships lies in their ability to create a sustainable structure at the outset. Alongside the provision of support tools for partnerships documentation as prepared during this project, additional assistance by Music Network with funding from the Arts Council, at the development stage of an emerging partnership is essential. This support could be afforded in a number of ways:
 - Mentoring assistance to the local lead organisation in engaging key partners or potentially to act as an agent to assist the engagement process on behalf of the agency who wishes to develop the partnership
 - Identification of the needs of emerging and extant partnerships within the MEP framework
 - Development of additional support materials to develop and assist the role of the Music Development Manager within the emerging partnerships in the operation of an MEP
 - In the absence of the publication to date of the Arts & Education Report there is a requirement for an agency, such as Music Network, to bring those operating as MEPs together on a regular basis to share best practice in relation to structures, approaches to provision in different locations and to different demographics and coherent development strategies for MEPs
- 3. The Arts Council in endeavouring to achieve their strategic goal of implementation of the Music Network report needs to provide assistance on an ongoing basis to Music Network for the roll out of the Music Education Partnership process on a national scale.
- 4. In order to ensure a coordinated approach to music education provision it is important that the Arts Council through Music Network develop relationships with those who are already embarking on a partnership path.

6. CONCLUSION

The Project team wishes to express its gratitude at being afforded the opportunity to work on this important project for the development of music education provision in Ireland. We wish to thank the CEO and team at Music Network for their assistance and the Music Education Working Group and its Chair, Aibhlin McCrann for their guidance and support throughout the project and also to those agencies and individuals who responded to the mapping process survey and those who took part in the advocacy and awareness building meetings.

We look forward ongoing developments within this field in the coming months with the awaited publication of the Report of the Special Committee on Arts and Education and to having an opportunity in the future to continue the work which this project has initiated.
